



C³ Sister Reminder (Chapter Challenge Captain)

Dear Chapter Presidents,

This is a friendly reminder that if you haven't registered your C³ Sister, it's not too late. The deadline is August 1, but late registrations will be welcome and honored. If your chapter doesn't have a C³ Sister, *please find someone in your chapter who is proficient using email, can navigate the website, and is willing to receive information on the Cottey College "Defining Moment" campaign to pass on to your chapter.* Registering is as easy and one, two, three:

1. Go to the Cottey website at www.cottey.edu.
2. Click on "Defining Moment" at the top of the first page.
3. Find "C3 Sister Registration" at the top of that page, and follow the instructions. You can fill out the form and submit it online.

OR: You can fill out the yellow registration card that came in your state convention kit and mail it in. Either way is ok – just do it!

Why is this so important? Because an international-wide P.E.O. competition is about to begin and your C³ Sister will receive videos, information, and news via the internet to pass along to your chapter sisters. *I'm asking every chapter in Nebraska to register a C³ Sister so that every chapter can participate in this competition.*

I just participated in a teleconference with the president of Cottey College, Dr. Judy Rogers, Past International President Barbara Andes, who is chairing the campaign, and the campaign manager at Cottey, Carla Farmer, during which they provided information about the structure and focus of the campaign. The Defining Moment Campaign for Cottey College has five objectives:

1. To provide a \$10 million scholarship endowment fund that will provide more scholarships to women, thus making Cottey more affordable for more young women from across the country and around the world.
2. To provide \$3 million in funds for additional faculty chairs.
3. To provide \$9 million to build a first rate fine arts building that will provide space for all the creative arts and give them the advantage of collaborating together in one building.
4. To provide \$3 million to update the library facilities and bring their electronic database offerings in line with those at competing institutions.
5. To set up a \$10 million unrestricted fund to meet today's needs, respond to unexpected circumstances, or fund a brilliant idea.

Dr. Rogers's vision for Cottey includes expanding the enrollment capacity from 350 students to 500 students and offering a 4-year baccalaureate degree. The campaign is in its first phase, which is individual participation, and it's about to enter the second phase, which is chapter participation. That's where our local chapters become involved, and that's why it's so important for every chapter to have a C³ Sister. So please REGISTER NOW, if you haven't already done so.
